

PAYMENT OPTIONS

PhlebotomyU offers students the following Phlebotomy Full Course discounts and payment plans.

We accept cash, check, credit, and debit cards.

The current cost of the Phlebotomy Full Course is \$2,900 \$2,195.

Available Discounts

PhlebotomyU offers the following student discounts:

- \$100 discount for students who pay in full before the first day of class.
- \$100 discount for students who are active military or currently working as a hospital or medical clinic employee, subject a valid ID card and/or verification.
- Group discounts for two or more family members or friends who jointly enroll in the same class. Please ask our administrative staff for further details.

Up to 2 discounts may be applied per student

Weekly Payment Plan

PhlebotomyU offers interest-free weekly payment plans. To qualify, students must:

- 1. Register for the course and pay the \$250 non-refundable registration fee
- 2. Submit a down payment of \$250 prior to the start of class
- 3. Execute a Payment Agreement
- 4. Setup an automatic recurring weekly payment of at least \$50 beginning on the first day of class.

Additional Notes

- A \$4 administrative fee will be applied against each payment.
- Payments that our declined or returned by the bank or credit card processor for insufficient funds or any other reason will incur the following fees:

o First time: \$10

Thereafter: \$25 each occurrence

As long as a student is current on their payments, they will remain eligible
to take the National Exam, participate in the classroom instructional
didactic and practical sessions, and complete a clinical externship.
However, students will not receive their course completion documents
(e.g., certificate of completion) until they have paid their account balance
in-full.

3rd Party Payer Financial Assistance

PhlebotomyU's program is too short to qualify for **federal financial aid**. However, on a case-by-case basis, PhlebotomyU accepts payment from select 3rd Party Payers organizations that provide financial assistance to students, such as MyCAA (for military spouses), Veterans Village of San Diego, and others. Students will need to contact these organizations directly to determine if they qualify for their financial assistance.
